Copyright Page

What information does the copyright page include and why is it important? This page tells you when the book was copyrighted. What does this mean? Think of a **copyright date** as the official "birth date" of a book. Why is it so important to know what the copyright date of a book is? Let's say you are writing about computers and have two possible books to use as sources. One book has a copyright date of 1991, and the other has a date of 2001. The 2001 book would have more recent information. Other times you might be more interested in an older book. Say you were writing a report about the history of developments in space travel. A book with an earlier copyright date would tell you how people thought about developments at the time and how they imagined space travel might be in the future. You could compare what their predictions were with what actually happened. Do you see why the copyright page can be helpful to you?

Other important information that is on the copyright page is the **place of publication** and **name of the publisher**. When you are writing information about your sources at the end of your report (the bibliography), you will need to include this information as part of your citation.
