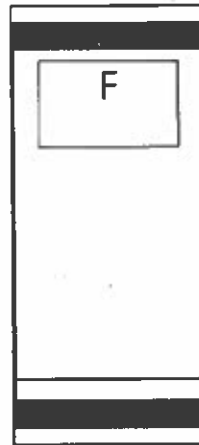
## Fiction Call Numbers

Books have "addresses" just like houses do. The call number helps you find a book quickly and easily. A book's address is called its **call number**, and it helps people find it on a bookshelf. The call number can be found on the book's spine.

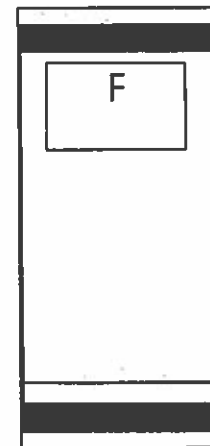
A fiction book has an *F*, for fiction, on its spine above the call number. Fiction call numbers are the first two letters of the author's last name. Fiction books are placed on bookshelves in alphabetical order by their call numbers.

### ► Look at the examples below.

1. Jeff Carpenter wrote *Fudge-A-Rama*, a fiction book. If you weren't sure if it was fiction or not, you could look at the spine for an *F*. What two letters would you find under the *F*? Write them on the book spine.



2. *My Night on Pluto* was written by Fawn Faraway. It is a fiction book. What two letters make up its call number? Write them on the spine.



3. On the book spine, write the call number for the book titled *Call of the Wild* by John Stuckey.
